


• Prevention Division

- Fire Safety Plan Reviews and Inspections

Investigation Division

- Cause and Origin Investigations

What we do...



• Emergency Response Division

- Train, equip, and support 9 regional contract Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT) Teams
- Coordinate the state Search and Rescue program
- Public Safety Education and Outreach



Provides free smoke alarms to fire departments.

- Firefighters or volunteers install in homes.
- Combination smoke / CO detectors
- For vision & hearing-impaired citizens:
 - Bed Shakers
 - Strobe Lights

Side by Side Burn Trailer


- New addition in 2022 donated by the National Fire Sprinkler Association
- Designed to show the effectiveness of fire sprinkler systems in a home setting.
- Hosting fire department must provide a few Firefighters and a fire truck with water



Kansas Firefighter Recruitment & Safety Grant

- \$400,000 budgeted for grants in FY 24.
- The application period will open in July 2024.
- Volunteer and Part-Time Fire Departments are eligible
- Grant money must not supplant the fire department budget (without grant, there are no resources to buy)
- Grant funds available for:
 - Structural Firefighting PPE
 - Wildland Firefighting PPE
 - New SCBA masks for individual members
 - Junior firefighter programs
 - Annual fitness for duty physicals for firefighters
 - (not covered by the individual's insurance or reimbursed by their department)
 - Gear Cleaning Extractors





A Sad Farewell to the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS)

- Established by the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974
- Originally paper forms submitted to each State Fire Marshal's Office, who maintained records and statistics
- Early 1990's, the system moved to a DOS based computer system with reports sent by fire departments to the State Fire Marshal on computer floppy disks.
- Updated over the years to the current version- but has many issues and is not user friendly

National Emergency Reporting Information System (NERIS)

• WASHINGTON — (May 9, 2023) The U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) announces the launch of the modernization effort to develop a new, interoperable fire information and analytics platform, known as the National Emergency Response Information System (NERIS), for the American fire and emergency services. This effort is being carried out as a partnership between USFA and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Science and Technology Directorate (S&T). The goal of NERIS is to empower the local fire and emergency services community by equipping them with near real-time information and analytic tools that support data informed decision-making for enhanced preparedness and response to incidents involving all hazards.
